


#### Chamber to Again Partner on Penn State Altoona Student Showcase

ture previous LBCY students talking about their experiences in the program. Leadership Blair County Youth is a program of the Blair County Chamber of Commerce.









For example, a response rate of 100% will mean that a school district, municipality, city, county and social service program will receive its maximum share of federal funding for the next ten years.
