

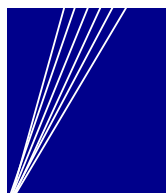


Chamber Office Closed for Independence Day

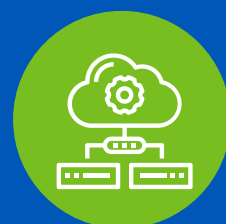

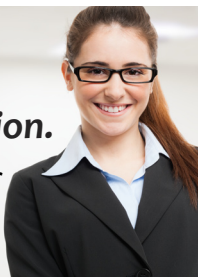
