## Making a regional impact

Our economy is regional. We are not in it alone. That is why Blair and Centre County Chambers are working together, sharing information, and contributing to their respective economic development plans.

“Our counties share a labor force, creating a regional neighborhood with people living and working between counties,” said Stephen McKnight, President of the Blair Alliance for Business and Economic Growth.

The Blair Chamber recently convened its Executive Roundtable where Greg Scott, President of the Chamber of Business and Industry of Centre County (CBICC) discussed Centre County’s market trends and their economic development planning efforts; efforts that link with Blair and surrounding counties.

“Our plan will need to consider assets and opportunities that extend beyond State College and Penn State University. That is why we have included Stephen McKnight and several CBICC members from Blair County to join our Economic Development Council,” said Scott.

“We welcome this ongoing exchange to identify where we can specifically work together and develop shared programs that benefit our members and the community overall,” Scott added.

Since the completion of Interstate 99 in 2006, Bedford, Blair and Centre

County have been growing closer economically. While Centre County uniquely benefits from the influence of Penn State University, other sectors such as health care, manufacturing and tourism are creating new, broader labor force connections and housing market demands beyond higher education.

“The time is right for these regional discussions to take place, as the Commonwealth launches it’s new economic plan, its first one since 2003,” Scott said.

Last fall PA Secretary of Community and Economic Development Rick Siger, spoke to the Economic Development Council and other regional stakeholders about the Commonwealth’s plan.

“I encourage all of our economic development leaders across the state to think and plan regionally,” Siger noted.

“Those that do will be in

a more competitive position to align for new state program qualifications and investment trends,” Siger added.

That state plan emphasizes new site development, main street programs, outdoor recreation, and regulatory reform as key pillars of the plan. It is now moving through the legislative process.

The Blair Chamber is committed to identifying and leveraging regional market opportunities for our members. The Chamber’s Executive Roundtable includes senior business leaders across many industry sectors.
