

## Shildt honored with 2024 LBC Fellow Award

Melanie Shildt has been named the recipient of the 2024 Leadership Blair County Fellow Award. The announcement was made at the annual LBC Alumni Breakfast on Friday, September 27th at Liberty Hall at the US Hotel in Hollidaysburg. Shildt, a graduate of the class of 2017, has remained active with the program. “The Leadership Blair County Program had a significant impact on my life. I highly value the program and feel it is an important part of our community. The program relies on alumni volunteers to assist Chamber staff in planning and executing each session, so I wanted to remain involved to be able to give back to the program,” says Shildt.

The selection process starts with nominations that

are submitted to former Fellow Award recipients who then review the nominees. The award goes to a person who continues to be involved with the LBC program as a servant leader. To be considered for the award the candidate must demonstrate contributions to the mission of Leadership Blair County, demonstrate servant leadership efforts for the stewardship of the Blair County Community, be a living example of the desired program outcomes, and in its truest sense the Leadership Blair County Fellow is an award for individuals who are convinced they do not deserve the honor. Fellow Award recipients selected Shildt based on her continued involvement with the LBC Adult Class sessions and the Adult Advisory Group. She is also an

active member of the LBC Alumni Advisory Group. They believe she knows the value of these programs for individuals to grow and to promote volunteer leadership in a community. “Before starting the LBC program, I knew servant leadership was important, but I don’t think I realized just how critical it was to building a strong community. I learned so much about the true scope of need in our community, the variety of opportunities to give back, and just how much one person could truly make a difference,” says Shildt. The Leadership Blair County Fellow Award is a surprise to the recipient. Shildt says she had no idea the award was going to her, “I was so humbled to receive this award. Though I definitely feel as though I

Most of the Blair County Chamber of Commerce’s membership consists of small businesses. To market these businesses, the Chamber has created a new video product – “Bouncing Around Blair.”

“Bouncing Around Blair was a great way to get information about the services we provide without it costing us any money,” said Richard Servello, program director of the Children’s Advocacy Center.

These one-minute videos are free to members and give an overview of their business. Chamber staff members Megan Rossman and Brittany Mayer visit businesses to film and produce a video to put on Chamber social media pages.

“It was a very seamless, well-organized process,” said Emily Sollenberger, branch manager at Kish bank. “It was engaging for community members to view and led to questions about Kish Bank.”

Many of the videos have over 1,000 views and are able to reach a new, large audience for these businesses.

“Our video has almost 2000 views and gave us the opportunity to reach those who might not normally see us on social media which is excellent exposure for any business,” said Laura Green from McCartney’s Workplace Solutions. “We jumped at the opportunity to film a Bouncing Around Blair because it allowed us the ability to reach a broader audience.”

When a Chamber member requests a “Bouncing Around Blair,” they are given multiple options for filming, voiceovers and scripts. It is a completely customizable

experience.

“Bouncing around Blair allows us to connect with fellow Chamber members in a different way,” said Green. “It offers first-hand insight into a business that you might not get from attending an HD500, committee event or other Chamber event.”
